We would like to introduce you to our full line of solid lumber furniture, built to be of heirloom-quality. Furniture is an investment that will last a lifetime and beyond, so we invite you to "Share the Heritage".

Our furniture is bench built by craftsmen of northern Indiana, order by order, and the hand-rubbed oil imparts a durable and beautiful soft luster finish. Several pieces were designed by our great grandfather in the mid 1800's. Linseed Oil and Old World Oil are used to enhance the life of your furniture and both are environmentally safe. We also feature dovetailed drawers with solid lumber bottoms.

All of our furniture is built from dried furniture grade lumber, primarily oak, cherry, pine and quarter-sawn white oak,

walnut and mahogany. It is important to remember that both environment and specie heredity affect a tree's structure and wood grain. Therefore, each piece of furniture is uniquely different from all others. Each type of wood will show its own characteristics of color and graining. Rather than warrant against these natural characteristics, we present them to you as unique traits of solid lumber furniture.

All solid lumber furniture will mellow or darken with age; therefore, a newly finished piece may be lighter in color than one which has been finished for some time. With time, however, the difference between the two pieces will gradually diminish. Pine, oak and cherry, quarter-sawn white oak, walnut and mahogany may also change more, especially if placed in direct sunlight.

Slight swelling or shrinking of wood, is natural, and may be caused by changes in humidity. We recommend the use of an air conditioner and/or humidifier to control the humidity levels within your home during the summer and winter seasons.
